What you need to bring:

Last year's tax return (whether AARP did it or not.); Social security numbers for taxpayer and dependents; W-2s from each employer; All 1099 forms (for a variety of miscellaneous income); Brokerage statements (make sure to bring all pag-

es in the statement); Educational and Brokerage forms (1099 B and 1098-T); Forms K1 or W2G; All retirement and pension forms (1099-R); For property tax or rent rebate, stamped as paid tax receipts or rent certificate signed by the landlord.

Tax Rent Rebate Applications are now available

The rebate program benefits eligible Pennsylvanians age 65 and older; widows and widowers age 50 and older; and people with disabilities age 18 and older. The income limit is \$35,000 a year for homeowners and \$15,000 annually for renters, and half of Social Security income is excluded. Property Tax/Rent Rebate application forms and assistance are available at no cost from Department of Revenue district offices, local Area Agencies on Aging, senior centers and state legislators' offices. Fresh Express— 02/25/20*
 (Registration Necessary)

* Fresh Express is a food program that is offered through Central PA Food Bank in Harrisburg. Elder Share, and CSFP are senior food programs (60+) also from Central PA Food Bank. These are all income based. Once a month (usually the last Tuesday of the month) they bring food to our residents. There are usually 2 fresh fruits or vegetables—we don't know what they will bring until they get here. There are dry goods like pasta, cereal, etc. as well as some drinks.

If you are registered for Fresh Express, ElderShare, or CSFP the food will be arriving on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>February 25th</u> at the Valley Terrace Community Center. Appointments are necessary in order to pick up food. If you are not signed up for Fresh Express, ElderShare, or CSFP please see Lydia to sign up or for more information.

- Medication Lock Box

 If you are interested in a free lock box for medication please see Lydia.
- Walking Stick or Cane- If anyone would like or needs a walking stick/ cane Roy Martin (303E) makes them and is happy and willing to give one to whoever would like/need one.

Reminders

Wayne Gardens is a wonderful community! If you are able to do so, please help your neighbors if you suspect they are hurt or otherwise incapacitated (panel light is on) verify their unit number, then check on them, it takes only a moment of your time. Let's all watch out for each other.

Please do <u>NOT</u> let anyone in without permission. If they are unable, for whatever reason, to access a resident with the menu you can assist them (if you wish). But please be aware of and respect everyone's privacy/safety.

Remember that smoking is NOT permitted in the buildings or in your units. Some of our residents are sensitive to the lingering odors/ smoke in the air.

Please remember that you must pick up after your pet.

Please rinse you recyclables before putting them in the collection cans. It has been reported that the unrinsed bottles/cans are attracting ants. <u>Boxes (food or mail) are not accepted as recyclable.</u>

Please remember to close the door to the trash room when you're done.

<u>Canes should not be used to push automatic buttons to open doors—use only hands. It interferes with the operation of the buttons.</u>

Handicapped spaces are <u>not</u> reserved. Anyone with the handicap placard can park there.

Please be mindful of the volume of voices in the early morning hours (before 7 am) by the front sitting area.

Please be mindful of your neighbors and lower the volume on TV, radio, etc. If you're an early riser or a night owl please remember that you have neighbors that may not be, so be aware of your noise levels (i.e.: doing laundry) especially between 10 PM and 7 AM.

Housekeeping

Please remember <u>do not flush</u> anything but toilet paper—<u>no paper towels, grease, pet waste or bulky/ personal hygiene items</u>. Thank you.

Maintenance calls-

When calling in a work order, please speak clearly/slowly and provide: name, address (development name), and issue. Maintenance will return your call—however, if your phone blocks unknown calls they will not be able to reach you. Please remove this feature when waiting for a return call.

Work Orders will be completed in the order they are received unless it is an emergency that needs completed in 24 hours.

Examples of emergencies are (but not limited to):

Plumbing leaks which could flood the unit or cause damage; Electrical hazards; No heat; Clogged toilet or clogged tub, if on a weekend and have no second tub and/or toilet; and completely clogged kitchen sink.

All other work orders will be handled as time permits. Changing light bulbs, etc. is not considered an emergency—no power or flooding is considered an emergency.


Heart Health Speaker Series
