Fresh Express

Fresh Express is a food program that is offered through Central PA Food Bank. This is an in person food selection event held at the Valley Terrace Community Center on the last Tuesday of the month. Residents bring bags and make food selections from items provided by the Central PA Foodbank. Usually there is a protein, milk, eggs, fresh produce and dry goods. If Fresh Express changes to a different day other than the last Tuesday of the month we will notify you via flyer. The time for Mount Vernon residents is 11:30. If you wish to start attending Fresh Express and have not enrolled/renewed enrollment in the past year contact Lydia to enroll.

Senior boxes (CSFP & Eldershare) with additional shelf-stable items are also available for those who meet eligibility income levels are age 60+. You must enroll ahead of time for these programs and commit to picking up your box every month. If interested schedule a time with Lydia to enroll.

Fresh Express Re-enrollment In July

July is our annual Fresh Express re-enrollment month. That means that when you come to Fresh Express in July you will need to make sure to sign a form with Lydia as you enter to re-enroll for another year. You do not need to provide any proof of income or ID.

If you are not coming to Fresh Express in July but would like to enroll or re-enroll you can do it in August-just make sure to tell Lydia you need to complete the enrollment form when you come.

Senior Fruit and Veggie Voucher Enrollment

The office on aging plans be at the Valley Terrace Community Center to distribute senior fruit and veggie vouchers on Wednesday, July 5th at 2pm. If

you would like to attend please contact Lydia for a time slot.

These vouchers are available if you are 60 years or older or turn 60 by the end of this year and make 26,973 or under for one person or 36,482 or under for two people. The vouchers can be used in participating local farmers market for locally grown produce. Last year the vouchers totaled value was \$24 but that may increase to \$50 this year


Produce Boxes

Lydia (Mount Vernon Supportive Service Coordinator) has been picking up produce boxes for residents in Chambersburg. Residents can then pick up their produce box from the Mount Vernon offices. The next produce box pick up will be on July 27th. If you have not signed up and would like to start picking up a produce box contact Lydia and she will add you to the list. Boxes are free. Please inspect produce before and discard any produce that has turned. Boxes include a variety of vegetables and sometimes fruit such as potatoes, onions, apples, etc. If you can not make it to the Mount Vernon office to pick up your box during business hours Lydia and you can arrange an alternate means of getting the box.

MAINTENANCE CHALLENGES

As most of you know, our region is struggling through staffing issues. Luminest shares that struggle. We've continued to work short-staffed in our maintenance department. We've hired people who then left for higher wages, several even before they were fully trained; others had to be let go for various reasons. We continue to struggle with this challenge. Often that leaves us with one trained person trying to do the job of two and sometimes three people.

We apologize for the inconveniences this may cause and appreciate those of you who show understanding and patience. We work according to the priorities we have established. Unfortunately, that means that sometimes we don't get to things like mowing or trimming or less critical items as quickly as we would like (and as quickly as many of you were used to before Covid). We remain in the hiring and training process with the hope of finding long-term success soon.

Please continue to call in your work orders so they are documented and remain in queue. And feel free to call us if you haven't heard heard anything for 3 weeks or more. Our great team is doing their best and will continue to address things that are brought to our attention.

Maintenance calls-

When calling in a work order, please speak clearly/slowly and provide: name, address (development name), and issue. Maintenance will usually only return your call if it is an emergency work order call made after hours—however, if your phone blocks unknown calls they will not be able to reach you if they have questions. Please remove this feature after calling in your workorder particularly if it is after hours. Please be aware that usually maintenance does not return calls for work orders that are non-emergency nor for emergency calls during regular hours unless they need more information. They do return calls for emergency after hour work orders.

Examples of emergencies are (but not limited to):

Plumbing leaks which could flood the unit or cause damage; Electrical hazards; No heat; Clogged toilet or clogged tub, if on a weekend and have no second tub and/or toilet; and completely clogged kitchen sink.
